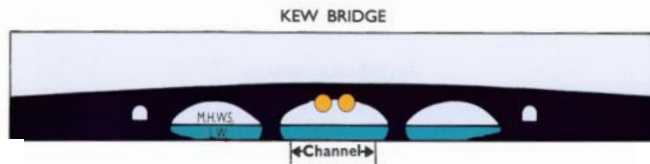


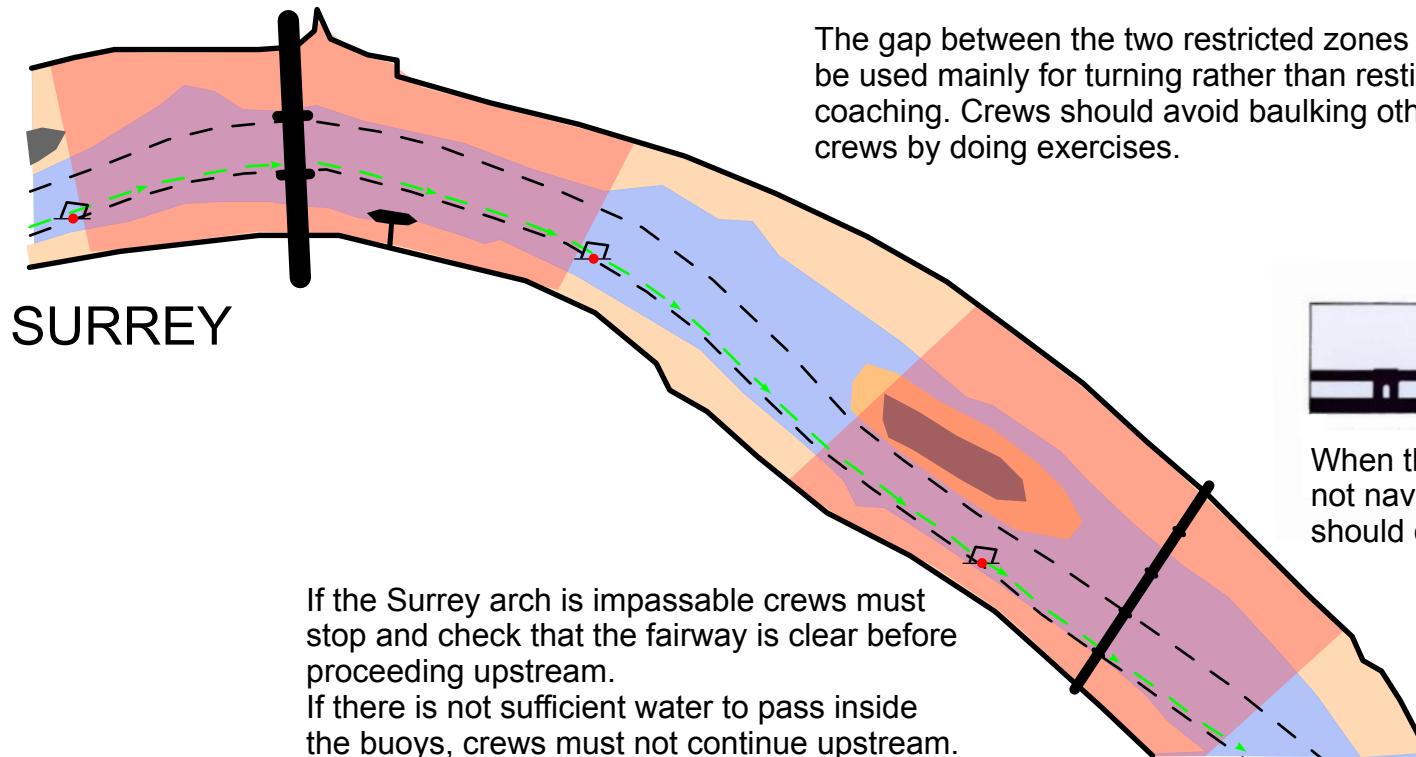
# Rowing on the Ebb between Kew Railway Bridge and Kew Bridge

## *Navigation rules when proceeding upstream*

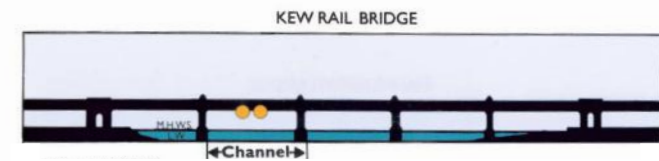


If the Surrey arch of Kew Road Bridge is impassable crews may not proceed upstream.

This part of the Tideway is difficult to navigate, particularly at low tide. All crews must be fully aware of the sections in "Rowing On The Tideway" pertinent to this reach of the Thames.



The gap between the two restricted zones is to be used mainly for turning rather than resting or coaching. Crews should avoid baulking other crews by doing exercises.



When the Surrey arch of Kew Railway Bridge is not navigable due to low water conditions, crews should consider turning before the restricted zone.

If the Surrey arch is impassable crews must stop and check that the fairway is clear before proceeding upstream.  
If there is not sufficient water to pass inside the buoys, crews must not continue upstream.
